The father, in a moment of profound vulnerability, placed his faith alongside his fear and declared, "I believe, now help my unbelief." (Mark 9:24)

The Beyond Belief Campaign, the first one Wildewood has done in over twenty years, will require us to ask God to lead us past fear and into faith.

As leaders, we have imagined how best to use our building. We envisioned the gym transforming into class spaces for adults; closets converted into restrooms, a vibrant patio, and the café

a state-of-the-art meeting space. We dreamed of a children's area that is safe and family-friendly. We want a gathering place designed specifically for our student ministry.

We realized that these dreams come with costs that rise each year. We prayed and sought wise counsel from the congregation. Then we asked if God was speaking the same message to you. Your approval vote 'YES' gave us the confidence to move forward

So, what's next in this journey? We continue by seeking God's guidance to continue our robust ministry. Next, we act in faith while using our resources of time, talent, testimony and finances to impact the world for Christ.

I believe that God is able to do far more than we have imagined. We will see greater ministry impact and evangelism than we have ever seen before.

As you read through this brochure, listen for the voice of the one who leads us and allow him to assure you that he is able to do far more than we can imagine. God wants to take us to a place called . . . Beyond Belief.

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Beyond Belief Campaign

Over 60 years ago, 18 people sat in a living room in Ralston and founded Wildewood Christian Church. Their vision and dedication to bringing the message of Jesus to the surrounding community has grown into a church of over 330 families.

The purpose is still the same, reaching those who are far from God with the Gospel story, then discipling them to deepen their faith walk that, in turn, they may pass the message along to others in their neighborhoods and the surrounding community.

While the message never changes, the challenges of contemporary culture dictate the urgency and means of how we share the message of Jesus with our community. Our goal is to be a multi-generational church that supports families in their faith walk.

In the past, Wildewood has taken bold steps to construct space that supports the mission of the church. In 1990, the existing building was dedicated. In subsequent years, two additions were added to accommodate the needs of the growing congregation.

Once again, we are at a point of change. The question is "How can we more effectively serve our congregation and community?"

The "Why" of Beyond Belief

Wildewood Church is growing! Over the past three years, we have developed a plan to help welcome more people into our church family. How do we accommodate this growth? How best can we use what God has given us to meet the needs of our congregation?

During this time we conducted a facility audit, which is a document that outlines how our facility is used and where deficits exist between our mission and our available space. The outcome of this audit revealed a deficit of classroom space and underutilization of the gym space. It challenged us to re-think how we handle the children's check-in

process and dedicated space for children and students. It also revealed a safety issue; the lack of any smoke or fire alarm system in the building. We believe that now is the time to correct these growth and safety issues for our church.

After three years of study, prayer and discussion, we believe that the Beyond Belief Campaign is the solution to take us to where we can better meet the needs of our congregation, enhance safety issues in the church, and continue to better reach the surrounding community.

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Your Beyond Belief Financial Commitment

To fund the building renovation, we are launching a 3-year campaign called Beyond Belief. Our goal for the campaign is \$1.4 million. When the congregation voted to proceed with the project, we had 90% approval. This overwhelming agreement in direction is amazing and a testament of unity in purpose. We trust God is leading us in this direction.

We believe that everyone has something to contribute to the goal and it will certainly take everyone to meet this goal. Yes, it is beyond belief! However, God promises us in Ephesians 3:20 "Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen."

We are asking everyone to prayerfully consider what God is calling you to give. This amount must be above and beyond what you already give and will require all of us at Wildewood to make a sacrificial commitment. Not everyone can give the same amount, but all of us can make the same sacrifice to complete the campaign. What is God asking of you? You can know by praying and asking God to direct your decision.

What is the Beyond Belief campaign?

Through meeting together for discussions and prayer, we believe God is calling us to utilize to the fullest what He has given us to continue our mission of making disciples through evangelism and nurture. We believe this goal is best achieved by renovating existing space in the building to better meet our needs rather than constructing a new addition or relocating to a different facility.

What are the plans for the renovation?

- 1. Create 3 classrooms in the current gym space.
- 2. Expanding the women's rest room to 5 stalls.
- 3. Renovating the existing kitchen into a family restroom and storage.
- 4. Create a new kitchen in the existing gym space.
- 5. Convert the education wing (south end of the building) into dedicated space for Children/Youth activities.
- 6. Enhanced security check-in for children.
- 7. Church-wide smoke/Fire Alarm System.

How long will the Beyond Belief campaign last and what is the project cost?

The campaign will be 3 years (36 months) in length. Financial commitments may be made to last for 36 months or some people may prefer to give an amount up-front. The total cost of the campaign will not exceed \$1.49 million.

What are ways people may contribute toward the "Beyond Belief" campaign?

On Sunday, May 5, we will offer the opportunity to make commitments to the campaign. These commitments can include and initial 'lead gift' that is an upfront contribution to help jump-start the campaign. You may contribute through the normal means of giving, online, through

the church app, or by check or cash. Please designate "Building Fund" in the check memo or online giving category.

What are "Gifts In Kind?"

We have also set up procedures for receiving non-cash and investment donations. Referred to as "Gifts in Kind", these are items of value which may include property or assets. For example, stocks, bonds or other investments that can be quickly liquidated but often provide tax benefits for the donor.

What is the timeline for construction?

Construction would begin as soon as donations and/or financing for the project have been secured. The length of construction is estimated to be 4-5 months. Some parts of the building will be unavailable during the construction process. Ideally, we would begin construction as soon as August 2024. However, contractor availability and appropriate financing will determine the actual start date.



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Prayer Guide

Our goal has been and will continue to be, following God where He leads us. We want see where God is working in our congregation and then join Him in this work. Jesus said, "Yes, I am the vine; you are the branches. Those who remain in me, and I in them, will produce much fruit. For apart from me you can do nothing."

We see God working here at Wildewood and are anxious to join Him in this work. We believe the next step involves making changes to our building to better meet this mission. If God is truly leading us in this direction and we are to join Him in His work, our part is not yet over. We must come together as a congregation to trust God in meeting the financial goals needed to make this happen. Our direction should not be giving equal gifts, but rather, making equal sacrifice.

The purpose of the prayer guide is to open the eyes of our hearts to see where God is directing our lives in service, in discipleship, and to deepen our faith-walk. Some specific prayer points for us are:

- 1. Praying for congregational unity in purpose.
- 2. Pray for each person to see their role in serving God.
- 3. Pray for those you know who are far from God.
- 4. Pray that God grants you wisdom in determining your financial gift.
- 5. Pray that God shows you where He is working so that you may join Him in His work in your life.



WEEK 1

Day 1: Monday, May 15 BECOME A GENEROUS GIVER

Proverbs 3:9-10

"Honor the Lord with your wealth, with the first fruits of all your crops; then your barns will be filled to overflowing, and your vats will brim over with new wine."

Day 3: Wednesday, May 17 TREASURING HIS PRESENCE

Psalm 73:28

"But for me it is good to be near God; I have made the Lord GOD my refuge, that I may tell of all your works."

The writer of this Psalm, Asaph, recognizes what is often overlooked in our busy day-to-day lives: to walk in the presence of God is to walk in a safe, peaceful place. Earlier in the Psalm, Asaph recounts in dismay that he has often witnessed the wicked (who do not walk with God)

succeed- in contrast to the faithful. Yet, before he can go so far as to claim that this is a permanent state, Asaph rejoices in a newfound truth: those who walk with God are in an enviable state, not the other way around. In God's presence, we are shielded from the onslaught of life; while trials will come, we have a sustaining shield to stand behind. To intentionally walk with Him is to make one's heart available to His whisper throughout the day, and to set one's feet for His sending. Today, let's walk in the awareness of God's presence, making ourselves present to His every move.



Prayer:

Lord, it is often quite easy for us to become discouraged in this world; while others don't love you and still succeed, your people face trials day-in and day-out. In these times of doubt, remind us that we, your children who love you, are led into green pastures by your good hand. Bring to our minds the peace and safety offered in your presence, as we take hold of the joy that you have freely given. Strengthen us to walk in your presence today. In Jesus' Name, amen.

Day 4: Thursday, May 18 GET UP!

Psalm 139:1-6

1 You have searched me, Lord, and you know me.

2 You know when I sit and when I rise; you perceive my thoughts from afar. "You discern my going out and my lying down; you are



familiar with all my ways. 4 Before a word is on my tongue you, Lord, know it completely. 5 You hem me in behind and before, and you lay your hand upon me. 6 Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too lofty for me to attain."

The creator of the universe has intimate knowledge of who we are. As the scripture says, "you are familiar with all my ways." However, sometimes we try to hide our true selves, even from our own thinking. Why is it that we want to avoid being confronted with the truth? We somehow imagine that if we just

hide, we can avoid facing the reality of who we are or what we've done. Here David writes so disarmingly truthful, reminding us that we cannot escape God's presence nor his knowledge of us.

We played "hide and seek" as children but for some people, that little game has continued with God. Our prayers often reflect more on material concerns rather than focus on who we really are. You are fully seen by God. Now is the time to ask yourself if you are ready to accept being fully known by your Creator.

Prayer:

Our Father, you know my inner-most being. You know my secrets and my heart. Even still you protect me, love me and want to have a deep relationship with me. Cleanse me from my sin, make me new again. Open my heart to yours that I may walk in the light and enjoy the comfort of your presence. Renew my spirit and bring healing to my soul. Only You can bring the refreshment that my heart longs for. Amen.

Day 6: Saturday, April 20 DOES GOD REALLY KNOW ME? (Part 2)

Psalm 139:7-12

"Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? 8 If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there.
9 If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea, 10 even there your hand will guide me, your right hand will hold me fast. 11 If I say, "Surely the darkness will hide me and the

light become night around me," 12 even the darkness will not be dark to you; the night will shine like the day, for darkness is as light to you."

Is there some aspect of your life that you are avoiding talking with God about? Perhaps you are choosing to ignore it. After all, if you are busy

with other things, maybe God will forget about it, or at least you will . . . but you won't. David reminds us that no amount of finagling or neglect on our part makes things go away. Adam and Eve tried hiding from God and it didn't work them, and it hasn't worked for anyone since! After all, wherever we go mentally or physically, "God is there." If shame has you wanting to hide something from God, it's time to step into the light and cast your burden on the Lord.

Prayer:

Almighty God, unto whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of thy Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love thee, and worthily magnify thy holy name; through Christ our Lord. Amen—from the Book of Common Prayer.

Day 7: Sunday, April 21 DOES GOD REALLY KNOW ME? (Part 3)

Psalm 139:13-17

"For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb.

14 I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well.

15 My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place, when I was woven together in the depths of the earth. 16 Your eyes saw my unformed body; all the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be.

17 How precious to me are your thoughts, God! How yast is the sum of them!"

our Creator and come clean as we journey with Jesus on his path to the cross. Scripture: Hebrews 12:1-2

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, 2 fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God."

Sometimes we get so focused on the "Thing that hinders us" such as a person who hurt us, a song in church that was too loud, or that sin that Satan keeps reminding us of. We focus on what we have done in the past, that we forget to focus on Christ, on being the person that God wants us to be. What are some ways that we can fix our eyes on God? Meditating on and learning scripture is a great place to start. If we are fixing our eyes on the goal, instead of fixing our eyes on the problems, God will carry us through, and the problems won't really seem like problems anymore! We have an eternal reward waiting for us in Heaven that is worth so much more than anything we might worry about here on Earth!

Prayer:

Dear Father in Heaven, please forgive me for the times I fail to keep my eyes fixed on you. I humbly ask you to help me to focus on your goodness and your unfailing love when the world tries to distract me from your presence. I thank you for your goodness and mercy, Lord

and forgiveness for all the times I have let you down. In your name I pray Amen.

Day 13: Saturday, April 27 YOUR TREASURE

Matthew 6:19-21

"Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. 20 But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. 21 For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."



This familiar passage of scripture is often used to remind us that we brought nothing with us into this world and we won't take anything with us when we leave. Our earthly possessions and pursuits, while important, are only temporary. What truly matters is the state of our hearts and our investments in God's kingdom. Our giving, service, and love for others are the treasures we lay up in heaven. As followers of Jesus, our goal, our purpose is to leave a legacy of kindness, love, generosity and sacrifice. Where are your priorities today? There is nothing wrong with obtaining material things in this world. However, that pursuit must be aligned

kingdom. We ask you align our hearts with your good and perfect will. Guide us and direct us for the benefit of your Kingdom. Amen!

Day 14: Sunday, April 28 GENEROUS HEARTS

2 Corinthians 8:2-5

"In the midst of a very severe trial, their overflowing joy and their extreme poverty welled up in rich generosity. 3 For I testify that they gave as much as they were able, and even beyond their ability. Entirely on their own, 4 they urgently pleaded with us for the privilege of sharing in this service to the Lord's people. 5 And they exceeded our expectations: They gave themselves first of all to the Lord, and then by the will of God also to us."

This story about the believers in Macedonia is a reminder of the joy of giving, even in times of trial. Paul's letter does not detail the circumstance of the trial, only the story of people who gave themselves, first to the Lord and second, to others. Their story is not one of boasting in the gifts that were given, but rather, the movement of God in the lives of people who are yielding to His will. Our faith may be tested by trials of 'many kinds' as we walk in this world. However, our victory is in Jesus, who had already conquered death and world. We can allow God to work from the abundance of our hearts even in the face of difficulties.

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, you have shown us time and time again that you are trustworthy and that your love endures forever. As you have blessed us generously may we enjoy the blessing of giving generously with gracious hearts full of joy for the rich blessings you have give to us. Amen!



WEEK 3

Day 15: Monday, April 29

MOSES PRAYED

Psalm 90:17

"May the favor of the LORD our God rest on us; establish the work of our hands for us—yes, establish the work of our hands."

We don't often think of Moses as a man of prayer ... but he was. Several places record something like, "Moses prayed for the people" (Numbers 21:7). But what did he pray? Psalm 90 is a prayer of Moses, so we have the actual words of one of his prayers. At the end of this prayer, Moses asks that "the favor of the LORD" come to his people. He prays that the "work" of their "hands" be established in their midst. As the New Living Translation put it, "May the Lord our God show us his approval and make our efforts successful."

Moses did not pray for the Lord to come and do everything for us. He prayed that the Lord bless the work we are doing for him. This is a timeless direction for our prayers, whether we are building a tabernacle in the ancient desert or working as a congregation to serve the Lord in our community today.

Prayer:

Lord God, may you bless our plans and give favor to our work for you. May we please you by what we do and how we do it. We pray in the name of our Lord Jesus, Amen.

Day 17: Wednesday, May 1 WHO GAVE MANKIND THEIR MOUTHS?

Exodus 4:10-13

"Moses said to the Lord, "Pardon your servant, Lord. I have never been eloquent, neither in the past nor since you have spoken to your servant. I am slow of speech and tongue." The Lord said to him, "Who gave human beings their mouths? Who makes them deaf or mute? Who gives them sight or makes them blind? Is it not I, the Lord? Now go; I will help you speak and will teach you what to say." But Moses said, "Pardon your servant, Lord. Please send someone else."

In the greater context of this passage, God is sending Moses to lead the people of Israel out of their Egyptian slavery. Moses had been privy to God's power; he encountered a bush that was on fire but not burned up, a voice speaking to him from those flames, and his wooden rod turned into an organic snake. He even saw his own hand become



consumed with diseaseonly to be healed instantaneously. Quite the proof of God's awesomeness, right? Still, when told to speak to the Egyptian ruler, Moses does not want to go. He uses his speaking disability as reason for

being unqualified for the mission, despite God's clear ability to do the miraculous. How often are we like Moses here? When God leads us to a person, place, or assignment, we can come up with many excuses for why we are not fit to act out his will. All the while, God walks with us, patiently saying, "who made you? Was it not I, the Lord?". Oh, what our lives would look like if we accepted God's invitation instead of living in fear!

Prayer:

Lord, I confess that fear often clouds your commands. Instead of trusting that you will see me through, my inability becomes an excuse to reject your assignments. I'm sorry. I thank you for your patience with me, and ask for courage today. Wherever you lead me, I will go- I don't need a burning bush to know you can use me for your glory. In Jesus' Name, Amen.
